Bible Family Feud

Well ahead of time, survey an adult study group or social-action group in the parish using questions such as those listed on page 27. Tally the responses to each question. For example, for the question, "Name a disciple of Jesus," the tally might read: Peter, 10; John, 8; Judas, 3; James, 1; Thomas, 1. You will need all the responses tallied and on hand in order to play the game with your youth group. The game is a variation on the TV show "Family Feud."

Create two teams. Have each team send a player to the front. Ask these two players the first question. The team of the player who gives the response that is also the most frequently given response of the adult group (to continue with the example above, the player who responds "Peter") has the option of playing or passing. If it passes, the other team must respond to the next question. The team that opts to play or is given the right to play is allowed only two mistakes while trying to name all the responses (or a maximum of the top six responses given in the adult survey). If the playing team fails to do this,

the opposing team has a chance to steal the round if it can name a correct response not named by the other team. The team winning the most rounds is the winner. Possible questions:

- Name a disciple of Jesus.
- Name one of the Ten Commandments.
- Name a parable of Jesus.
- Name a city in Israel.
- Name one of Saint Paul's letters.
- Name one of the plagues of Egypt.
- Name a famous character from the Hebrew Scriptures.
