Introduction

This Bible study is designed to help you understand the fourth statement in the Apostles' Creed: "I believe in the holy catholic Church."

The word "catholic" means "universal" ... so you could say universal church if you wish. The Bible passage describes what happened after Pentecost when so many came into the church (3,000 new believers in one day) that they decided to gather in homes to care for each other.
