## Free to Be

Vocation is a call from God to a basic life commitment—a commitment which will enable us to become the best person we can be. It is a call to holiness, to a share in God's life. Ultimately there is only one Christian vocation; it is the call to commit ourselves to the love of God through love of neighbor.

Because it is a call—not a demand—we are free to respond or not respond. But the personal consequences of not responding are worth considering.
