I cannot help thinking that the Next Step will be really new; it will go off in a direction you could never have dreamed of. It would hardly be worth calling a New Step unless it did.

The Christian view is precisely that the Next Step has already appeared. And it is really new. A change from being creatures of God to being sons of God. The first instance appeared in Palestine two-thousand years ago.

I have called Christ the "first instance" of the new man. But of course He is something much more than that. He is not merely a new man, one specimen of the species, but the new man. He is the origin and centre and life of all the new men. And He transmits it not by heredity but by what I have called "good infection." Everyone who gets it, gets it by personal contact with Him. Other men become "new" by being "in Him."
