The Catholic way

3- Catholics believe that when Jesus said to Peter "upon this rock I will build my Church" that He meant for there to be a specific leader for His family, as they would journey through human history.

4- Catholics love and respect, but do not worship Jesus' Mother Mary. Mary is not equal to God, she is a creature. Catholic men consider Mary a role model, even though obviously she is a female. This is because of the greatest thing she did: she gave human flesh to Jesus. This is what every man has the opportunity to do while he is alive. Through his life he can give Jesus a body that He can love through.
