Jesus Brother of the Poor.

From the beginning of his life, Jesus was homeless, for their was no place for him in the inn.

When his parents took him to Jerusalem for the first time they were numbered among the poor and they offered the gift of the poor.

As a child he was a refugee, forced to flee the hatred that broke out in persecution, to leave his own land and live in exile.

As a boy, he was able to confound the learned teachers with his wisdom, but he still worked with his hands as a humble carpenter like his foster father, Joseph.

After explaining the scriptures in the synagogue at Nazareth, the carpenter's son was rejected.

Even one of the disciples chosen to follow him asked "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?"

He was also the victim of injustice and torture and was put to death without anyone coming to his defense.

He was the brother of the poor; it was his mission -- for he was sent by God the Father and anointed by the Spirit -- to proclaim the Gospel to the poor.
