Hang up 20 or so photos of people (all kinds...old, young, attractive, ugly, fat, slim, wealthy, poor, etc.). The first week the pictures are displayed, have the kids write descriptions of each person based on what they see in the picture. Collect them all and during the following week, combine all the individual descriptions into a concise paragraph that accurately reflects the group consensus. Attach the descriptions to each picture for the next meeting. Have the students look at the photos with descriptions carefully (make sure they are numbered) and then answer the following questions:

- Choose five people you would want to travel with for one year. Why?
- Is there any one person you would not want anything to do with? Why?
- Who, if any, would you be willing to marry?
- Who, if any, would you worship with?
- Which person do you think you could really like? Why?
- If only five others and yourself were allowed to live and the others executed, which five would stay with you? Why?

You could have your group go through the questions again and decide how their parents would respond. And, of course, you can easily come up with other questions equally as good as these. .
