Look at Joshua 2:1-21, Joshua 6:20-25, Hebrews 11:31, and James 2:25.

Reflect on these questions.

Q: What do you learn about God in these passages?

- Why do you think that message stands out for you?

Q: Are there any ways in which you're like Rahab? Reflect on that a bit.

- Are there ways in which God is treating you like he treated Rahab? Reflect on that a bit.

Q: If the story of Rahab demonstrates how God accepts people, what do you want to do in response?

A SECOND, THIRD, AND SIXTY-THIRD CHANCE

Read John 8:1-11. Then reflect on these questions.

Q: What stands out for you in this story?
• Why is that important to you?

Q: Does it feel more normal for you to treat people the way Jesus treated the woman caught in the act of adultery or the way her accusers treated her?

Q: While Jesus doesn't condemn her, he does make it clear that he wants her to stop her adultery. What does that tell you about Jesus' view toward you when you sin?

Q: Do you know anyone who's becoming a better person because he's getting sexual do-overs? Reflect on that a bit.

Q: Do you know someone who could use sexual do-overs now?

Q: And you? How easy is it for you to believe Jesus might really give you do-overs when you need them most?
