## CRIME and PUNISHMEN'T

Set up the meeting space like a courtroom with a judge's bench, jury box and defendant's chair. Recruit a volunteer to play the first judge for this activity. Have the judge choose six group members to be the first jury. The jury takes its place and the judge explains that the first defendant has been tried and found quilty. You or a volunteer may serve as the clerk of the court and read the charges of the first defendant as described below, embellishing both the description of the defendant and the crime.

The judge then gives the jury 3 minutes to decide on an appropriate punishment for the defendant. When the time is up, the judge calls for the jury's decision. A representative of the jury stands and announces its decision. Repeat the activity for the remaining defendants on the list. For each defendant, recruit a new judge and new jury members.

## Defendants/Crimes:

- Jenny: 7-year-old female who took three cookies from her grandparent's cookie jar without permission
- Daryl: 18-year-old male whose neglect led to the accidental death by drowning of a 3-year-old boy he was babysitting
- Bianca: 29-year-old female whose drunk driving resulted in the death of a mother and her two children
- Randy: 41-year-old male who fatally stabbed another man in an argument over drugs
- Ken: 53-year-old male who raped an 18-year-old female
