Five Attitudes

for Success

Attitude can make or break a career climber's success. Mary, a former executive with IBM in New York City, outlines five attitudes that are crucial for Christians in the workplace.

1. Don't complain. It's a Biblical principle (Phil. 2:14) sadly lacking in business. Complaining is at epidemic levels, and the positive person will stand out and survive longer than the gripers.

2. Do it right and do it now. Procrastination and mediocrity also inflict the workplace. Most tasks can be completed immediately and correctly. Few workers follow this principle consistently, and suffer the consequences of inefficiency.

3. Pray for the company. It's easy to view the job as secular rather than sacred. But the Apostle Paul admonished Timothy to pray for those in secular positions (I Tim. 2:2). Praying for others can change negative attitudes toward them. So intercede for your management, peers, and support staff.

4. Work harder and smarter, but not longer. If a job can't be done within the work day, something's wrong with the person or position. If there's continually too much work, request assistance or a job restructure. The Christian who's a 15-hour, six-day-a-week worker sabotages chances for ministry and becomes self-absorbed and one-sided.

5. Don't carry a chip on the shoulder. After someone's wronged you, forgive and forget it. Grudges distort objectivity. Women should not be oversensitive because they're trying to succeed in a maledominated field. It does more harm than good.

People are successful if they have lived well, laughed often, and loved much; if they have gained the respect of others who are intelligent and the love of children; if they have filled their niche and accomplished their task; if they leave the world better than they found it; and if they have looked for the best in others and given the best they have.
