Current Research at the NIAM

The NIAM is currently engaged in clinical and basic science research projects which are at various phases in collaboration with the National Cancer Institute (Bethesda, MD), The Central Council for Research in Ayurveda and Siddha Medicine (New Delhi, India) and the Richard and Hinda Rosenthal Center for Alternative and Complementary Medicine at Columbia University (New York, NY). A brief summary of these research endeavors is given below.

The National Cancer Institute research involves the evaluation of an Ayurvedic medicine, Semicarpus anacardium (Linn.) for antitumor effects. Preliminary studies indicate that certain cancers are inhibited by the nut extract of this tree. The NCI is assessing direct cytotoxicity activity as a criteria for further studies.

The Central Council for Research in Ayurveda and Siddha Medicine research involves a specific herbal-yoga-meditation protocol for asthma, developed by Dr. Gerson, which is being evaluated in a placebo-controlled cross-over study.

The Columbia University project involves the collection of data on Ayurvedic herbal medicines used to treat various women's diseases and conditions including: perimenopausal symptoms, pre-menstrual symptoms and dysmenorrhea (painful menstruation) and others.

One of the most exciting studies in alternative medicine assesses the effect of Panchakarma Therapies on liver detoxification capacity. This four year project represents Dr. Gerson's Ph.D. research thesis.

The NIAM is preparing for publication the results from its study of the bark of the tree Terminalia arjuna (Wight & Am.). A series of 14 patients showed a 20% reduction in serum cholesterol after four months of treatment with this herb in dosages of 500 mg bid.

We also have completed two related studies on the effects of aromatherapy and Vedic meditation on EEG brainwave patterns in humans. Additional current research involves herbal protocols for asthma, hypertension, herpes genitalis, depression, type 2 diabetes mellitus and other multi-modality treatment protocols for obesity, fibroids and CFS.

The 7000 square foot facility houses the Research Center, Panchakarma Retreat Center and the Seminar Center. Many medicinal herbs used in Ayurveda grow in the Herb Garden and throughout the property. The NIAM Research Library is the largest collection of Ayurvedic literature in the United States and includes writings and research papers in English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Malayalam, Marathi, Tamil and several other languages. The kitchen and food preparation area was designed specifically for teaching purposes.

Our Mission

The NIAM was created to set and maintain the highest standards of Ayurvedic activities in the United States. We are an institution oriented towards both the scientific and the spiritual and strive to integrate the two. Our specific aims are:

- to provide the lay public and scientific community with credible and accurate information regarding Avurveda.
- to conduct basic scientific and clinical research aimed at objectively evaluating the safety and efficacy of Ayurvedic treatments.
- to provide information about Panchakarma Detoxification Therapy, which is available through Avurvedic Medicine of New York, our sister group.

About Scott Gerson, M.D.

Scott Gerson, M.D., is one of the nation's leading authorities on Ayurveda and its integration with conventional modern medicine. He is well-versed in virtually all modalities of alternative medicine. He received his medical degree from the Mount Sinai School of Medicine where he helped establish that institution's first course for medical students on complementary medicine. Currently he lectures on Ayurveda at both Mount Sinai and Columbia Presbyterian College for Physicians and Surgeons. He has been a staff physician at the New York University Medical Center, Bellevue Hospital and New York Downtown Hospital, where he completed his residency in Internal Medicine.

Dr. Gerson received his formal training in Ayurvedic medicine at several institutions, including the Ayurvedic College at Trivandrum and The Arya Vaidya Sala in Kottakkal. He was awarded his Fellowship in Avurveda from the Institute of Indian Medicine in Poona. He is the author of Ayurveda: The Ancient Indian Healing Art (Element Books, 1993), Medicinal Plants of Avurveda (Spring 1999 release), in addition to numerous papers and articles on Ayurveda and alternative therapies. In addition to his private medical practice and his duties at the NIAM, he serves as the director of The Foundation for Holistic Medical Research, a 501c-3 non-profit group which evaluates complementary treatments from all corners of the globe. Finally, he co-hosts his very popular weekly radio show, Integrative Healing: Ayurveda and Beyond and gives occasional talks at local schools and hospitals.

Dr. Gerson lives with his wife and two dogs in Brewster, NY, where he often gathers locally growing

Correspondence Course in Ayurveda

Ayurvedic Delegations to India

Dr. Gerson brings a small group to India each year to visit research facilities, botanical gardens, universities and panchakarma centers. Includes governmental agencies and access to sites otherwise unavailable. Usually 10 days, these excursions are life-transforming Costs vary each year according to flight, hotel and other fees.

Vedic Meditation Initiation

Considered the cornerstone of Ayurvedic health regimens, the NIAM offers these initiations to individual who express desire to practice this daily meditation.
