## Situation sheet

1. Your teacher compliments you for your work on the senior party. You know that you didn't do anything at all on the project but that it was Sally Flemming who was mainly responsible for the party's success. What would you do?

- a. Say, "Oh, it was nothing!"
- b. Tell her that Sally Flemming did almost all the work and that the success of the party belonged to her.
- c. Thank your teacher for noticing your contribution.
- d. Tell her that you are always glad to help and that she can all on you anytime.
- e. Tell her that you did not really carry your weight on the committee.

2. Your friend has a motorcycle and you want to learn how to ride it. As a favor to you, he takes you out and teaches you. You think that you know what you are doing and ignore his warnings of caution. You go too fast, lose control, hit a post, and demolish his motorcycle. He has no insurance on his cycle. You end up in the hospital with a badly broken leg. What would you do about the motorcycle?

- a. Figure, "Tough luck. He should have carried insurance!"
- b. Blame your friend for not being a better teacher.
- c. Chalk it off as one of those things and pray for the repair of the bike.
- d. Take it as an obligation of honor to pay for the repair of the bike.

4. You notice that one of your close friends is frequently absent from class and has not been normal in relationships lately. You happen to walk into the restroom at school and see your friend smoking marijuana with some other students. What should you do?
