R

REALISTIC

These people have athletic or mechanical ability. They prefer to work with objects, machines, tools, plants or animals. They usually like to work outdoors.

I

INVESTIGATIVE

These people like to observe, learn, investigate, analyze, evaluate or solve problems.

A

ARTISTIC

These people have artistic, innovative or intuitive abilities. They usually like to work in an unstructured situation using their imagination or creativity.

S

SOCIAL

People in this category like to work with people. They like to inform, enlighten, help train, develop or cure people. They also may be skilled with words.

E

ENTERPRISING

These people also like to work with people, but they like to influence, persuade or perform. They like to lead or manage for organizational goals or economic gain.

C

CONVENTIONAL

People in this group like to work with data, have clerical or numerical ability and carry things out in detail. They usually enjoy following other people's instructions.
