## FOEDNGUP

Provide a variety of pieces of paper, square or rectangular. Have at least one for each kid. Include napkins, notebook paper, carbon paper, tissue paper, newspaper, construction paper, onionskin, toilet paper, Kleenex, and paper towels. Make sure there are a few extra-large pieces. Let all the kids choose a piece before they know what the paper is for.

Offer five dollars to anyone who can fold their piece of paper in half nine times or more. (Eight is the absolute limit.) This can be used either as a quick crowd breaker or as an illustration.
