

JENGA CHALLENGE

Here's a great game that adds a new twist to an old game.

First get a copy of the block game Jenga. Then divide the blocks into five equal piles (since there are 54 blocks, one pile will have one fewer than the rest), and paint the blocks four different colors—you can leave the last pile unpainted. Then you'll have to come up with a challenge for each of the colors, such as saying a movie quote when they pull a green, or singing a song for blue, or quoting a Scripture verse for a plain piece.

Then when you set up the game, try to evenly distribute the colors throughout the tower. What makes it funny is that teenagers will now try to avoid a color—because they can't
