EIGHBORLY CHAIRS

Here's a fun variation of Musical Chairs. Make a circle of chairs, facing inward. Have one less chair than people.

Have your group members sit down. The person without a chair must stand in the center of the circle.

Have the person in the middle ask someone, "Do you love your neighbor?" If the person answers no, then that person and the person on either side of him or her try to switch chairs. The person in the middle tries to get an empty chair. No one may return to his or her original chair. One person will always be left standing in the center of the circle.

If the person answers yes, then that person must add "but I don't like anyone who's wearing red" (or some other description). All people who fit the description must find a new seat.

After the game, you may want to lead a Bible study on love using Luke 10:25-37; 1 Corinthians 13; and 1 John 4:7-8.
