## Puzzle Cards

1. Create a set of puzzle cards using the puzzles on pages $165-166$. Number the cards as shown. (You may prefer to copy the puzzles onto large cards. I use $6^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime \prime}$ cards.)
2. Give each group a sheet of paper. Tell the groups to appoint a secretary who will number the paper from 1 to 40.
3. Divide the cards into as many packs as you have groups.
4. Put a pack of cards face down on each table. Say:

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On each of these cards you will find a number and a puzzle which stands for a common word or phrase. When I say "Go," turn the pack over, spread the cards out on your table and try to figure out the puzzles. When you know an answer, tell your secretary the number and the answer. Work quietly so you don't give your answers away to the other tables. When you finish the whole set, raise your hand.
5. When one group finishes, call " 30 seconds." After the 30 seconds, say:

Pack up your cards and pass them to the next table. (Establish a pattern for rotating the cards.)
6. When all the groups have had all the cards, read the answers aloud. The table with the most correct answers wins.
