Is your youth ministry mission statement memorable and motivating... or just a set of awkward words people aren't sure they understand? Here are six diagnostic tools:

- **1. Is it scriptural?** Good mission statements indicate how a group is accomplishing God's objectives as outlined in the Bible.
- 2. Does it inspire us? Words are powerful motivators. If you don't sense agreement and awe when discussing the mission statement, start over.
- **3.** Is it distinct to our specific niche? Don't settle for a copycat mission statement. Make sure it reflects your church, your group, and your group's situation and destination.
- **4. Does it push us beyond maintenance?** Inherent in a God-given mission is the idea of transformation and change. Otherwise it would simply be a job description.
- 5. Does it encourage others to become catalysts—or consumers? Make sure your mission statement reflects more than "services rendered." We're called to help others become servant-leaders.
- 6. Does it provide hope for the future? A mission statement captivates not only by presenting challenges but also by promising meaningful results.
