It was another typical day at North Raleigh High School: three fights, one arrest for possession of a firearm, and the usual drug-sniffing dogs making their rounds along the lockers. As far as Lauren was concerned, school wasn't fun anymore.

Which was ironic. After all, she was the one who refused to attend the private school her parents wanted her to go to. She said she didn't believe Christians ought to hide from the real world. She wanted to be in a public school with her friends in the real world, she declared, instead of in some exclusive private school where everyone was protected from the "the world's" influence.

But Lauren's mind had changed. After history two guys followed her to her locker, then came up on both sides of her.
